

Getting a distinction in your research task.

For your extended learning project, you need to complete some research. It is very easy to cut and paste information from the internet, but this will not get you many marks.

It can sometimes be a bit tricky to tell if someone has put the information in their own words, so the following guidelines should give you some ideas to help make this clear:

1. *Change the style of your writing.* Information on the internet is usually written in a formal 3rd person style, so use a different one—you could write it in the first person, as if you were the person him or herself, or write it in a really chatty, friendly tone.
2. *Put it in a different format.* Write a script for an interview on a chat show, or create a PowerPoint presentation with your information organised onto different slides.
3. *Include a bibliography.* As you need to prove that your information has come from more than one place, make sure you include a list of the books and websites that you have used—this will also make it easier for your teacher to check that you haven't just copied great big chunks.

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
