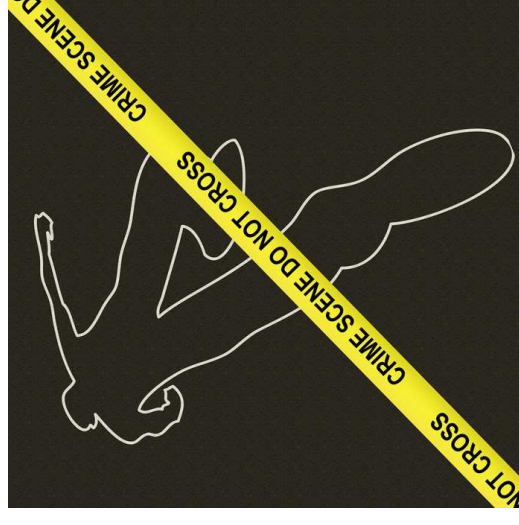
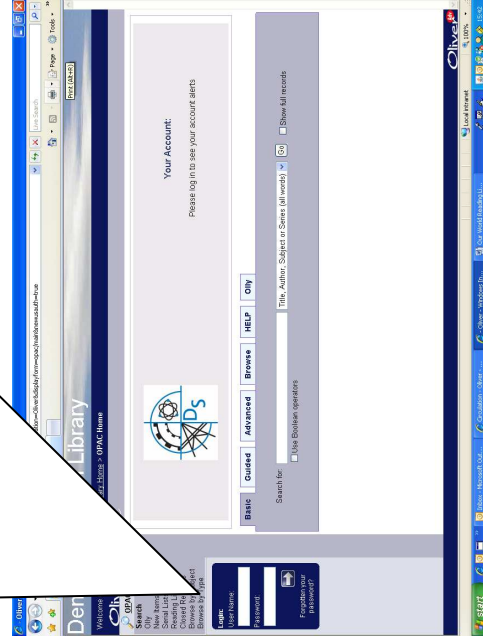


Murder Most
