



Celebrating Denefield Friday 25 March 2022

Creative and performing arts


The Creative Faculty is made up of four vibrant and successful subject areas: art, design & technology, music and drama, and as we approach the Easter break, there is a great deal going on. Our GCSE and A level students are working hard towards their final exams and coursework submissions. Last week we held a two day PPE exam for our GCSE Fine Art and GCSE Art, Craft and Design students. We were really pleased with the efforts of Year 11, many of whom produced outstanding works of art. Students now have until 9 May to complete their coursework submissions.





Some examples below of GCSE outcomes produced in the ten hour PPE










Elsewhere in the Faculty, Year 11 have recently completed their practical components in Level 2 Hospitality and Catering, where they designed and produced exciting menus for a number of different purposes. During the practical day, students made mouth-watering dishes, using the culinary skills they have learned on the course. In Design & Technology Year 11 students are currently creating prototypes (3-D models) for their controlled assessments, while in Music they are rehearsing for their GCSE performance evening on 29 March. In Drama they are practicing for their forth coming improvised performances, having recently completed their written PPE exam.





Extra-curricular activities, as ever, are a strong aspect of the faculty's work. We are currently running Year 7 Art Club, Architecture Club, GCSE Art Club, 3-D printing club, Year 9 D&T club, Fashion and Textiles club, Baking Club, Ukulele Club, and Junior Choir.



As well as these clubs, our Green Power racing team now with two cars, are working hard to prepare the cars for the new racing season. We are currently experimenting with a narrower wheel base so we can develop a more aerodynamic profile.

We have a full fixture list of races to look forward to, with the first happening on 8 May.







Undoubtedly our biggest extra-curricular event which has taken place this week, was our production of 'Little Shop of Horrors'. Students were rehearsing for months to ensure they were ready for the first night on Tuesday 22 March, the show then ran for a further two nights. Covid-19 information

The government is now advising those who have any of the main Covid-19 symptoms or have tested positive for Covid-19 to isolate, rather than making this a legal requirement as previously. The main symptoms remain: New and continuous cough; High temperature or

Loss of, or change in, sense of taste or smell.


As a result, any student who has any of these main symptoms should: take a PCR test and self-isolate unless the PCR test is negative; take an LFD test on days 5 and 6 (where day 0 is the date of the onset of symptoms); if both LFD tests are negative then self-isolation may end; if LFD tests continue to be positive, then self-isolation ends at the end of day 10.

The school reserves the right to ask a parent/carer whose child is presenting with Covid-19

symptoms to remove them from school until they test negative.

We have a small residual stock of LFD tests that can be made available for students who are selfisolating; LFD tests can also be ordered through <u>www.gov.uk</u>.
