


Celebrating Denefield Friday 18 March 2022

Covid-19 information

The government is now advising those who have any of the main Covid-19 symptoms or have tested positive for Covid-19 to isolate, rather than making this a legal requirement as previously. The main symptoms remain:

New and continuous cough;

High temperature or

Loss of, or change in, sense of taste or smell.

As a result, any student who has any of these main symptoms should:


take a PCR test and self-isolate unless the PCR test is negative;

take an LFD test on days 5 and 6 (where day 0 is the date of the onset of symptoms); if both LFD tests are negative then self-isolation may end;

if LFD tests continue to be positive, then self-isolation ends at the end of day 10.

The school reserves the right to ask a parent/carer whose child is presenting with Covid-19 symptoms to remove them from school until they test negative.

We have a small residual stock of LFD tests that can be made available for students who are self-isolating; LFD tests can also be ordered through www.gov.uk.

School Site Safety

A polite reminder that parents/carers and visitors to the school site by car should follow the school parking and one way guidance:

- Students should not be driven onto the school site at the beginning or end of the school day.
- Please drop children at an appropriate stopping place outside the school grounds the school buses need clear access to enter and leave the car park
- When collecting students throughout the school day for appointments please use proper clearly marked parking bays
- Do not park on double yellow lines
- Do not double park along the side of the Montessori/Piaget buildings at the front of the school toward the 3G pitch
- If collecting students from after school activities on the 3G pitch or field please use the main car park and walk to collect students please do not double park
- Please continue to use the one way system through the school gates, do not attempt to enter the exit only gate by Knowsley Road roundabout.
