



Celebrating Denefield Friday 1 July 2022



Art, Design and Technology

On Tuesday 22 June we were delighted once again to welcome students, friends, parents/carers to our annual Da Vinci art and design exhibition, held in the Da Vinci Space at Denefield. The exhibition was made up of Year 12 and Year 13 A Level Fine Art and A Level Photography portfolios, some Year 12 Design & Technology drawings, and some selected Year 11 Fine Art and Year 11 Art, Craft and Design final outcomes.

This was the first exhibition we have held for two years, due to the pandemic, and it was lovely to see so many people attending the opening night. Prizes were awarded for the best Year 12 portfolio, the best Year 13 portfolio, a Special Interest award, and the main Da Vinci Award, which is awarded for the most creative portfolio in the exhibition from any year group and in any discipline.

The judging panel was chaired by Mr Towill, and he was joined by two former colleagues from the art department Miss Leigh and Miss Bryan.

The Year 12 Prize was awarded to Diana H for her excellent A Level Photography work, and her lovely images of flowers and plants.

Race for life



Friday 8 July 2022

We are really excited to announce that we will be holding our own race for life event on Friday 8 July in order to raise funds for Cancer Research UK. This will be one of the activities taking place during our CHARACTER days.

Students from all year groups (7-12) will have the opportunity to run, walk, dance, cartwheel their way around our 5km course.

This year there will be two races being run. Years 7 and 8 students will take part in their race together whilst later in the day Years 9 and 10 will come together to complete their race. Students will be informed closer to the day of the exact timings of their event. This is intended to be an opportunity for students to have fun, and do something really worth while in aid of a very deserving cause.

There is no pressure for students to race, but can be choose to be as competitive as they like.



In addition, we are encouraging students to consider fundraising for this event in the form of sponsorships, or any other creative ways they may come up with. However, we acknowledge that finances are being greatly squeezed for many and fundraising may not be possible for all therefore fundraising is complete voluntary. We do expect all students to take part in the event regardless.

To further support this event, school will be hosting a 'non-uniform' day with a suggested minimum contribution of £2 for the opportunity for students to wear non-school uniform. Students will be asked to consider wearing the colours of pink or blue (the colours of race for life).

Email issues

We've been advised by our communications provider, IRIS Reach, that there are issues with some parents/carers not receiving school emails in their Outlook or Hotmail account. Unfortunately, Outlook and Hotmail may be preventing the delivery of some messages from us because their filters identify them as Spam or Junk.

There are a couple of things you can do to help you receive emails we've sent:

- Add @schools.ps-connect.cloud to your Safe Senders list in your email account
- Provide an email address that isn't Hotmail or Outlook if you have one
- If you are using the Hotmail or Outlook app, try using the web browser or desktop version

• Refrain from deleting emails from the school as Hotmail and Outlook algorithms could treat repeated deletes from the same email address as potential spam

Please contact us if you think you haven't received messages and we can check our records.

Second hand uniform

We are very happy to accept donations from parent/carers of old school uniform that we can reuse, but we also wanted to make you aware that Denefield has now registered for parent/carers to use the online service provided by Old School Uniform.

Old School Uniform (OSU) was started in 2019 and was built to offer parents/carers and schools the opportunity to give away or sell their unwanted school uniform items free of charge.

There many benefits for using their site:

Helping the environment by recycling and not sending to landfill.

Users have the ability to view items without registering. With their unbranded shop, parent/carers can pick up unbranded items from all across the country.

If parent/carers have registered, they can receive notification when items are added to their chosen school, so they are always up to date with what is happening on their school shop page.

Parent/Carers can add additional schools to their account.

How it works

Parent/Carers would register for an account. They would then activate their account. Finally, login and start uploading unwanted items. Parent/Carers will contact you via the messaging system when they want an item.

Parent/Carers can pay on collection or pay via a paypal account or similar. Some people do bank transfers, but the choice is solely down to the seller to arrange with the buyer.
