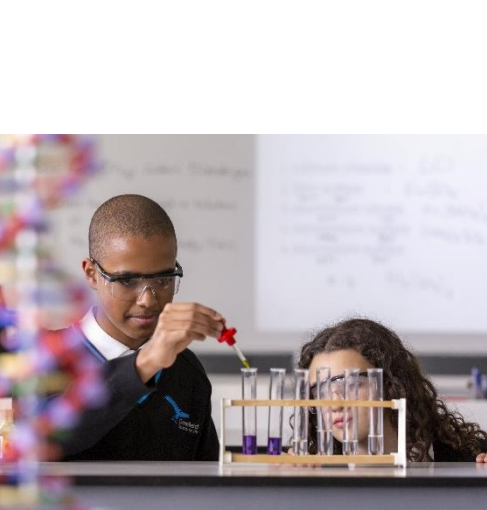


Celebrating Denefield Friday 16 September 2022





It will come as no surprise to know that a significant focus of the school's work this week has been the life and legacy of the late Queen Elizabeth II. I have been greatly impressed with the sensitivity and understanding that students have brought to discussions of the monarchy and the monarch, in lessons such as History and Success for Life, and in conversations in corridors and playgrounds. Mrs McHugh, Deputy Headteacher, devoted her assemblies to the late Queen. A copy of this can be found [here](#). She explained carefully about the concept of constitutional monarchy with the Queen, rather than an elected politician, as Head of State. She explained that Elizabeth was never destined to become Queen, but when she acceded to the throne in 1952 she devoted her life to the service of others. Mrs McHugh emphasised the Queen's longevity, but also her humanity and compassion. Students were particularly interested in the Queen's response to the Aberfan disaster in 1966, when a landslide from millions of tonnes of coal waste engulfed a primary school,



killing 116 children and 28 staff. Visiting the town in the South Wales valleys, a visibly moved Elizabeth received a bouquet of flowers with the message 'from the remaining children of Aberfan.' The Queen returned several times, to show her sympathy and solidarity with the stricken assembly. The life of Queen Elizabeth II means different things to different people. To us as Denefield, it is about her tireless devotion to her people, and her compassion and sensitivity. As Mrs McHugh put it, she was the embodiment of the phrase 'Work hard, be kind.'

The school will be closed on Monday 19 September as a mark of respect to the late Queen, and to enable students to view the funeral proceedings.

A reminder that the school closes at 12.40pm on Thursday 22 September, to enable students and staff to attend Open Evening. All Year 6 students and their parents / carers are warmly invited to attend. The evening begins at 6pm, with talks from the Headteacher, Year 7 students and the Head Boy and Girl, at 6pm, 6.45pm and 7.30pm. The evening concludes at 8.30pm.

A final reminder that the school has an INSET day on Friday 23 September.
