


# Celebrating Denefield Friday 3 February 2023





### Careers news

We were very fortunate to host a visit from the Forbury Nursery Group and Chiltern Training who came in to talk to students in Years 10 to 13 about working in the childcare industry and what an apprenticeship or traineeship entails. Students were able to hear about the skills and attributes it takes to work in the industry as well as how to be successful applying for a position and what prospects apprenticeships have moving on. Childcare and education is a growth sector in the South East of England and sees a number of students both from Year 11 but increasingly after completing Level 3 qualifications like A-levels and our BTEC Level 3 health and social care course. Students represented the school outstandingly, asked many really pertinent questions and were able to take away brochures and put their name down for more information on vacancies and work experience opportunities. Thank you to both these organisations and to our Health and Social care teachers for their participation in a very valuable experience for our students.
