



Celebrating Denefield Friday 24 March 2023











Along with final preparations for the French visit to Normandy next week, this week saw the long awaited and much anticipated school show 'Bugsy Malone.' And what a show it was. The quality of singing, dancing and acting, from a cast of 30 students drawn from Years 7 to 11, was simply fantastic. There were many, many standout moments – the sublime solos sung by Mollie in Year 10 and Megan in Year 11, Lucas's (Year 8) dazzling suit and equally dazzling solo, Rosie's (Year 10) or Elise's (Year 11) command of the stage as Bugsy Malone and Fat Sam respectively, or Darcey's (Year 8) extraordinary combination of pretending to die in one scene and pretending to box in another. The cast were supported by a live band that included Daisy (Year 12) playing both flute and saxophone (not simultaneously); Daisy was recently awarded a Distinction in her Diploma in flute by ABRSM – the highest award that can be given, and that only comes after the best part of a decade of learning and practising



an instrument. The show showcased the talents not only of students, but also of our dedicated staff. My thanks go to Mr Shaw (director), Mrs Shaw (choreographer), Mrs Idowu (musical director), Mrs Lotter (stage design), and Mrs Williams (piano).

This week's update is from our Art department

It's exam time in the art department and students in Year 11 and Year 13 have been working very hard to complete their component 2 portfolio work in GCSE Fine Art, GCSE Art Craft and Design, A Level Fine Art and A level Photography, in preparation for their exams. The exam dates are 22 and 24 March for the GCSE art & design subjects, 25, 26 and 27 April for A Level Photography, and 2, 3 and 4 May for A Level Fine Art. Students have been working very hard on this work, and we are expecting a successful series of exams.



Year 7 are currently working on their Indian Fighting Kites project, which focuses on pattern, and teaches students colour theory and painting technique. Students are just beginning to draw out their kites after a period of research work, during which they explored the art and design of India. Year 8 have been working on a portrait project and have produced some wonderful semi-abstract monochrome portraits









Year 9 have been working on their Pop Art Food project. During the project students have researched the art of artists such as Sarah Graham, Claes Oldenburg, and Andy Warhol, and have produced Pop Art prints, and Ceramic outcomes on the theme of food. Students in Year 9 have also recently chosen their options GCSE, and we are very pleased that so many of our 'art superstars' in Year 9 have decided to carry on their creative education in the art department by studying GCSE Fine Art.







Year 10 and Year 12 are currently developing their own themes. Year 10 work is based on the starting point of 'Manufactured or Natural Forms'. For this, students are developing many wonderful and creative ideas, and we now have projects based on many varied themes such 1970's Rally Cars, Jelly Fish, Human Anatomy, and the films of the Japanese animation company Studio Ghibli.







Year 12 in both Fine Art and Photography, following a number of exercises designed to develop technique, students are also working on their own personal ideas including projects on architectural towers, knitted masks, and digitally drawn interiors.





One member of the Art team has been particularly busy lately. As you will be aware, our fantastic Drama department have put on an excellent production of 'Bugsy Malone' this week. Our technician Mrs Lotter has single handedly produced a fantastic set, as well as numerous props for the production, from 'splurge guns' and 1920's telephones to Gangster suits and flapper dresses. Well done Mrs Lotter for all your creativity and hard work on this year's production. Also well done to our Creative Faculty colleagues in Drama and Music, Mr and Mrs Shaw, Mrs Idowu and Miss Nicholl. You are all so Denefield!
