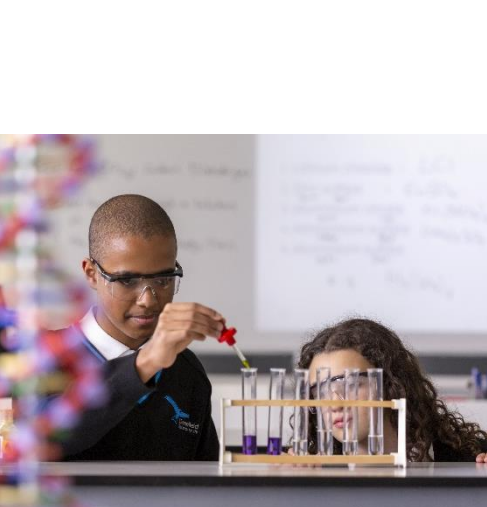


## Celebrating Denefield Friday 21 April 2023





I hope the first email of the new terms finds you good and well. Two themes have been prevalent at Denefield this week: celebration and overcoming adversity. With regards to celebration, over 150 Denefield students and their parents/carers attended the CHARACTER awards on Thursday night. As parents/carers may be aware, the school has nine CHARACTER values at its heart. The first three - confidence, happiness and articulacy - are personal values. The second three - resilience, ambition and courage - focus on determination and perseverance. The final three - tolerance, empathy and respect - focus on kindness, and making the world a better place. As well as gaining certificates for demonstrating CHARACTER values, students were awarded trophies for specific subjects, for extra-curricular activities such as Combined Cadet Force and Greenpower and for acts of kindness. The Pride of Denefield Award this year went to the school's Equity, Diversity and Inclusion



group, led by Miss Bennett and Mrs Williams. The superb musical accompaniment was provided by Elisha, Mollie and Ellie in Year 10, and Lily in Year 11. Congratulations to all those who received certificates and awards!

My first-week back assemblies focused on adversity and how while everyone at some point will be affected by adversity it does not define us. I shared examples from history and media - Frederick Douglass, Franklin Roosevelt, Sylvester Stallone, Tom Cruise and Oprah Winfrey. I then focused on the extraordinary Lily Rice, now 18 years old. Lily was born with paraplegia, and by the age of 10 had lost the use of her legs. She then became a determined wheelchair motocross competitor and was the first female to land a backflip in a wheelchair. She then went on to compete in the Commonwealth Games, winning a bronze medal - this time for swimming. All these people used their resilience, articulacy and courage to overcome adversity. They were assisted by those who showed the kindness values of tolerance, empathy and respect. My message was that while we will all be affected by adversity at some point, the impact it has on us depends on how we use our CHARACTER values. During my assemblies I also reminded students of recent measures we have put in place to keep students safe in school - measures that students themselves asked for. For example, we now have a separate set of toilets for Year 7 to eliminate overcrowding, we now permit students to use any set of stairs when going upstairs in the A-block at certain points in the day, we have introduced a physical listening box for students to share concerns, as well as having a safe and quiet space every Thursday lunchtime for students who want quietude or to share information with staff.
