Below are a series of tasks that we would like you to complete in order to prepare yourself for studying A Level English Literature.

- Buy and read the first few chapters of the following novels: Spies by Michael Frayn; The Great Gatsby by F Scott Fitzgerald
- Buy and read the opening scenes of the drama texts All My Sons by Arthur Miller and Othello by William Shakespeare
- Buy and read 5 poems from the poetry text Feminine Gospels by Carol Ann Duffy
- Organisation Task Buy a lever arch file and some file dividers. Divide your file into the following sections, in this order:

- 2. Paper 1 Section A Othello
- 3. Paper 1 Section B Unseen Poetry
