


Celebrating Denefield Thursday 20 July 2023

Year 7 residential 2023

110 students across Year 7 visited Kingswood Green Park last week for the 2023 instalment of the Year 7 Residential. Testing their nerves and resilience to the limit, students participated in activities such as abseiling and climbing up and down a 40ft wall. Comments such as 'I hate heights' and 'I am not going up there', quickly turned into 'that was so amazing, let's do that again' as students repeatedly put themselves out of their comfort zone and overcame some of their biggest fears. There was even time for the staff to go up there, with Mr Raw being quoted as saying 'I'm old and if I can do it, so can you', whilst being serenaded to the Mission Impossible soundtrack.

Other activities such as Nightline and Problem Solving required the students to work more collectively as a team, as they had to either navigate an obstacle course whilst being blindfolded, or work together to move through and around different tasks and problems. Students were then required to put their best duelling foot forward and do their best Zoro impression as fencing was also on our list of activities. Learning moves such as a thrust, lunge and repost, the students swished and flicked their way to learning new skills. Their final activities also required them to test their survival skills as they had to build their own shelters using an A Frame, or to start their own fires using a flint. Some fires were more successful than others and burned brightly for 20 minutes, whilst others did not have much success and could not get it past lighting the cotton wool. Despite this, the students showed a lot of resilience and kept trying for the full hour. To round off both trips, the students were sat around a large campfire singing songs based on Boa Constrictors, White Polar Bears and visits to a manners museum.

Both trips were hugely successful with the students being a credit to the school and their parents/carers back home. The Kingswood staff even commented that the students were some of the best they had ever had there and that we would be welcome back anytime. 




Denefield extra-curricular 2022-23



This year Denefield has been able to offer a variety of extra-curricular activities with an average of 20 per term. Clubs on offer have included 3D printing, Architecture, Athletics, Baking, Boxing, CCF, Chess, Cricket, Design Technology, Drama, Enterprise, Feminism, Pride, Gardening, Green Power, KS3 Chess. Students have been able to participate in these at either at lunchtimes and afterschool. This year we have seen an increase in attendance in most year groups and the provision of what we offer continues to grow. Currently more boys are attending clubs than females. 473 students have attended an extra-curricular club during the year. The House with the best attendance was **Kentwood**.



The Kite Awards

For students that have attended two different clubs for 10 weeks or more will have received their Kite Award. This was a new programme set up last year to encourage students to participate in extra-curricular activities, through Adventure, Enthusiasm and Discovery. Students are encouraged to participate in new activities and challenges across their time in school across all years. There is no progression – but completion of all 5 awards in 5 years would result a significant achievement. Awards can be completed at any time. This accounts for seasonally activities and this award is achievable by anyone. Here are the numbers of those that have achieved the award in its second year.


Note to current Year 9 DofE

Students should aim to have their Bronze completed by 20 October.
