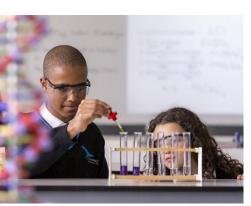


Celebrating Denefield Friday 8 September 2023















Firstly a very warm welcome to Year 7 parents/carers, and to any others whose children have just joined Denefield. Secondly, a huge congratulations to last year's Year 11 and 13 students for their outstanding exam results in the summer. Denefield's GCSE results broke all school records, with each student gaining an average of nearly one grade higher in each subject than in 2019. We have always had a friendly rivalry with our neighbouring schools in Tilehurst, but Denefield's GCSE results this year put the school at or near the top of all schools in Reading and West Berkshire. Our students last year had excellent attendance and punctuality, worked hard in lessons and at home, and listened carefully to the advice that their teachers gave them. Many congratulations to each and everyone of them on their excellent achievements.



It has been a delight to see all students back in school. They are smart, and punctual, move around the school courteously and respectfully and are working hard in lessons – despite the warm weather. Our extra-curricular activities are already beginning, with a Greenpower racing event imminent and a Year 11 theatre trip to Blood Brothers taking place next week. The full extra-curricular programme will be published in due course, and we will be holding a launch event where all students can sign up to whichever club or activity they wish to participate in. You will see details of our PE clubs later in this newsletter which are starting next week.

Over the next term we will be changing the way we communicate with parents/carers. We are replacing MyEd with ClassCharts – a mobile app and website that gives parents/carers live access to all the important information on their child – attendance, punctuality, rewards, homework and, where relevant, sanctions. We will be establishing a more comprehensive social media presence, so parents/carers can see what is happening at the school and celebrate their child's successes more easily and quickly than at present. Every week I will be sharing a short videocast with parents/carers on how things work at Denefield and why we do what we do – the first one will be next week. And then every short term I will be holding a 'headteacher's open house' where parents/carers can meet me, share any ideas and discuss any concerns they may have. Once all this is up and running the newsletter will be issued less frequently – perhaps once a short term, or six times a year.
