


Celebrating Denefield Friday 15 September 2023











Thank you all for your support as Denefield students continue their great start to term. Students are working hard and happily in tutor groups and lessons and are conducting themselves with kindness and courtesy around the school site. Our focus on cross year-group relationships in tutor groups has begun well. Our new canteen arrangements are operating smoothly, with two identical serveries opposite each other, thus increasing capacity. Although there are inevitably queues, they move quickly and students act patiently and sensibly while they wait.

Some of our extra-curricular activities have already begun, with the first Greenpower cars taking to the tracks in regional competitions, and the Drama department taking Year 11 students to see Blood Brothers in Oxford. Library news

Library inductions will be organised and run by tutor groups this year so all students will have a refresher and introduction to the library. In the meantime, please see the general information below and feel free to contact the librarian, Mrs Fogarty, at <u>bfy@denefield.org.uk</u> if you have any other queries.



Opening times: The library is open at break and lunch (although no food is allowed in the library) and after school until 4.00pm for students to read, borrow books, and use the computers and printer for homework.

Borrowing books: Students can borrow up to five books at once. Books are issued for two weeks but can be returned early or renewed. Students with overdue library books will receive a letter via their tutor explaining that overdue items are charged at 5p per day (excluding weekends and school holidays) up to £5. Items that are lost or damaged beyond repair are charged £5 towards a replacement. New items cannot be borrowed if there is an outstanding charge or overdue book. Fines can always be paid at a later date so it is advisable to return items asap. If there are any issues or concerns, students are asked to speak with Mrs Fogarty who can override the system if necessary.

Students can also sign up to be a library helper, working at the desk once a week at break or lunch to issue, return, and shelve resources. Ask in the library for more information.
